309										1373: at the Scottish Parliament when the succession to the throne was again settled.		
310										1373: Charter by George to Henry de Ogoull of the lands of Popill in East Lothian (b).		
311										1380: Percy, now E. of Northumberland, again entered Scotland rekindling the former troubles and for three days ravaged the Earl of Dunbar's lands (a -p.58).		
312										1380, June 12: John, Duke of Lancaster (the English kings uncle) came north to meet with the Scot. King on border difficulties. The Earls of Dunbar & Douglas, the Lord of Galloway and the Earl of Carrick (Robert II's eldest son) met with them at Berwick. They then met again on the 18th at Abchester, near Ayton and a truce was concluded (a - p.58).		
313										1380-84: Earl George made a pilgrimage to the Saint of Canterbury during this time.		
314										c1384: The English Baron of Greystock, with his family & furniture & possessions were moving north to take over a garrison when they were captured by the Earl of Dunbar and taken captive to Dunbar Castle (a - p.59).		
315										1385: The Truce ended and while Richard II of Eng. attacked Scot., setting fire to Edinburgh and the abbey of Melrose, the Earls of Fife, Dunbar & Douglas crossed the border with a army and laid waste to the precincts of Newcastle.		
316										1386: Hostilities continued until a further truce was concluded between the Earls of Dunbar & Douglas on the one hand, and Lord Neville on the oter (a - p.59).		
317										1388: The parliament of Robert II of Scotland at Aberdeen decreed to invade England to retaliate for some of the destruction inflicted through Berwickshire. James, Earl of Douglas (known as the 'Black Douglas') with the E. of Dunbar and the E. of Moray invaded Northumberland with 3000 men. They met in battle with Henry (Hotspur) & Ralph Percy in the battle of Otterburn (Aug. 1388). During this battle the Earl of Douglas who was leading the forces was killed. (a - p.60-63). The Earl of Dunbar then took over.		
318										When King Robert III's eldest son & heir, David, Duke of Rothesay, broke his contract to marry the Earl of Dunbars daughter Elizabeth (1389). The Earl of Douglas ('the grim') had plotted against this alliance so that David married his daughter Marjorie Douglas in Feb. 1400. The Earl corresponded with Henry IV of England who invited him south for talks (March 1400). Earl George of Dunbar left his castle at Dunbar in the hands of his nephew Maitland of Lethington. The Earl renounced his Scottish allegiance. In his swearing Fealty & homage to King Henry IV he was granted the forfeited estates of the Lord Bardolf, includingthe castle & lordship of Somerton in Lincolnshire and the manor of Clippeston in Sherwood Forest.		
319										1400 (> March): Robert II dispatched the young Douglas to Dunbar Castle which Maitland surrendered on the first summons. Earl George on his return found his principal place of strength (Dunbar Castle) in the hands of the son of his rival & so was forced to withdraw to England.		
320										1401: The Earl of Dunbar, with 'Hotspur' (Henry Percy) and a English army entered Scotland burning Hailes, Traprene & Merkhill before being forced to retreat with some loss to Berwick (a - p.67).		
321										1402: Henry IV, pleased with Dunbars conduct gave him access to the English castles, forts and towns: also giving him a E400 per pension. The Earl of Dunbar in conjunction with Lord Perch continually harassed the Scottish borders (a - p.67-8). Douglas who now held Dunbar & Edinburgh Castles, had the Border forces at his command. In Aug. 1402 he invaded England & penetrated Newcastle. The Earls of Dunbar & Northumberland, with 'Hotspur' & other assembled their forces and confronted Douglas who was posted on the hill of Halidon, located about 1 mile from Wooler (Sept. 14, 1402). The English archers with their longbows rained arrows upon the Scots causing great loss. The Scottish chief, Sir John Swinton unable to bear the slaughter of his soldiers called them to follow him down the hill against the enemy. Adam Gordon, a foe of Sir John begged forgiveness & joined him. The two with a hundred men closed combat with the English but were soon completely routed (a - p.68-9).		
322										1403: After the Battle of Halidon Hill K. Henry IV sent congratulatory letter to the Earl of Dunbar, the Percy's & others (a - p.69).		
323										1403, July 23: The Earl of Dunbar took part in another battle at Shrewsbury. As the English success was largely attributed to the Earl and his son, Henry bestowed on them ample rewards. (1405).		
324										1405 Lord George Dunbar held the castle of Colbrandspath as Lieutenant (a - p.70).		
325										In 1407 the Earl was involved in a dispute with the Dean of Lincoln about tithes (a - p.71)		
326										c1406: after the death of Robert II, King of Scotland, Earl George was beginning to with for a return to his native land. He treated with the Regent Albany for his restoration to Scotland, which was effected by charter dated 1409, Oct. 2. This was after George resigned

971										him and Edward then went to Dunbar Castle where he gained shelter (b-p.37-38). With		
972										Patrick's assistance he escaped down the coast to Bamburgh Castle (b-p.38). After this		
973										defeat of the English Patrick made peace with his cousin King Robert I.		
974										1315, Apr. 26: Patrick was at Parliament at Ayr when the Succession of the Scottish Crown		
975										was settled on Robert Bruce and his heirs.		
976										1318, March: as Sheriff of Lothian was at the capture of Berwick.		
977										1320: a signatory to the letter to the Pope asserting the independency of Scot.		
978										1332: With the death of the Regent during the Princes minority, Donald, Earl of Mar & Patrick,		
979										Earl of Dunbar were appointed by the assembly of estates as joint guardians of the prince (b-p.39).		
980										1332, May 11: Some Barons, with John Balliol raised a fleet of English ships & sailed to		
981										Kinghorn in the Firth of Forth in July. A body of Scots under Sir Alexander Seton opposed		
982										them but were defeated & Seton slain. The Earl of Mar assembled a large army to arrest the invading		
983										progress towards Perth but were surprised at night on the moor of Duplin & the whole force		
984										slain. The Earl of Mar was slain in his tent, also falling were Thomas Randolph, the young Earl		
985										of Moray (brother of the Countess of Dunbar), Robert Bruce, Earl of Carrick and others.		
986										The Earl of Dunbar & Lord Archibald Douglas were nearby when this happened & hastened on		
987										to Perth. Perth with its supply line cut off was put to seige so that on Feb. 2, 1333 Dunbar &		
988										Douglas concluded a truce with Balliol. The infant Bruce had been sent to France under the		
989										care of Sir Malcolm Flemming (b-p.40). Balliol full of confidence was crowned at Scone &		
990										then dismissed most of his English followers He was attacked near Arran by Douglas, his army		
991										defeated & chased into England.		
992										1333, July 19: at Halidon Hill (battle) - Expecting retaliation from England a strong garrison was		
993										placed at Berwick under Sir William Keith & the Earl of Dunbar took the defence of the castle		
994										(b-p.41). On July 15 Berwick & the castle were forced to capitulate & both delivered to the		
995										English. Before Edward left Berwick the Earl of Dunbar & others swore Fealty & then Patrick		
996										E. of Dunb. & Lord Henry Percy were appointed joint wardens of all country south of the Firth.		
997										1334: "Miller" states the Castle of Dunbar had been dismantled on the approach of the English		
998										but was now rebuilt at the Earls own expence to maintain an English garrison (b-p.42).		
999										1334, Feb. Patrick attended parliament at Edinburgh when John Balliol ceded Berwick, Dunbar,		
1000										Roxburgh & Edinburgh to England for ever (b-p.42).		
1001										1335: The Scots again revolted against Balliol & Earl Patrick retired to the highlands to join friends		
1002										of Bruce. In April he attended a parliament at Darsie in Fife (b-p.42).		
1003										Dunbar Castle was a great annoyance to the English subjects in the southern territory,		
1004										hence its reduction became a priority to Edward.		
1005										1337, Jan: The destruction of Dunbar Castle was attempted. The Earl Patrick at the time was		
1006										employed in the north reducing fortresses & so the defence of Dunbar was left to his Countess Agnes.		
1007										His wife, Agnes Randolf because of her dark complexion was commonly called "Black Agnes".		
1008										The Castle, newly fortified was considered impregnable. During the seige Agnes performed		
1009										all the duties of a bold, vigilant commander, suited out in armour. When the Earl of Salisbury		
1010										bought a huge battering ram to bear against the portals it rung harmless against the rock		
1011										(b-p.44-45). After 6 weeks the English were compelled to abandon the seige (b-p.49).		
1012										At some point during the seige Sir Alexander Ramsay of Dalhousie & his brave followers		
1013										managed to enter the castle with a supply of Provisions (b-p.11)		
1014										Dunbar meanwhile took the castles of St Andrews, Leuchars & Bothwell. In 1339, with Lord Robert		
1015										Stewart (guardian in place of Murray who had died) they conquered Perth.		
1016										In 1340 they made inroads into England but Edward again bought a powerful army north & the Scots		
1017										were induced to sue for a truce for 6 months. In Mar. 24, 1342 a safe conduct was signed at		
1018										Westminster for the Earl of Dunbar to treat for a final peace.		
1019										David Bruce had now reached 17 years of age & returned from France. Patrick Dunbar now		
1020										attended to the monarch as a councillor.		
1021										1346, Oct. 17: While the King of England was at the seige of Calais, David Bruce entered Northumberland		
1022										with 50,000 men, reaching the gates of Durham. Queen Phillipa assembled a body of troops		
1023										under Lord Percy met the Scots at Nevilles Cross. The Scot army formed a line with Dunbar		
1024										& the High Stewart of Scotland commanding the right flank, David Bruce the centre, and the		
1025										Earls of Moray & Douglas the left. The English archers began with a shower of arrows. The right		
1026										division under the Earl charged the archers causing disorder. However Balliol advanced on the Earl		
1027										with a large body of horse supported by the archers forcing Dunbar to retreat. David would not		
1028										quit the field & was eventually overpowered and surrendered to John Cpoeland. Thomas Randolph		
1029										Earl of Moray was amongst those slain in this battle (b-p.51-52).		
1030										With the death of her brother John, the Countess of Dunbar became the sole possessor of his vast		
1031										estates as he had no heir. Therefore the Earl of Dunbar assumed the additional title of Earl		
1032										of Moray (c1357/8). As a result the Earl of Dunbar & his countess obtained the Isle of Man,		
1033										the lordship of Annandale, the baronies of Morton & Tibbers in Nithsdale, of Morthington &		
1034										Longformacus, and the manor of Dunse in Berwickshire; with Mochrum in Galloway, Cumnock		
1035										in Ayrshire and Blantyre in Clydesdale (b-p.52).		
1036										1357: David Bruce remained a captive of England & in 1357 the Earl of Dunbar was one of those
