In 1372 Gaunt had retained Swinton as an esquire with the high fee of £20. Following Gaunt's own French expedition he retained Swinton as a knight doubling the fee (k). Lived during the reigns of Kings Robert II Stewart and III of Scotland. Under the Stewarts, Scots were able to arm themselves and hire themselves out to the English or French. John of Swinton, who must have been quite young availed himself of this provision and rode south to make his fortune. He served under the Duke of Lancaster (John of Gaunt), and his brother Edmund. Lancaster had castles & manors all over the country & a large retinue on peers and knights. John of Gaunt was a King in Spain & in England a Royal Duke, being the richest and most powerful subject the country had ever known. (e) It is not known under whose banner John first took service, but soon he was following John of Gaunt. He is soon at court and when campaigning the Duke (of Lancaster) will [pay to] 'convey him and his men and horses across the seas, and will ..... recompense him if his horses are taken or lost.' 'Lancaster - no bad judge of soldiers - was so anxious to have him that both as Squire and Knight he paid him double fees and gave him special privileges.' John's whole history proved that he 'was not only a man of valour ..... but a master of his weapons, ..... such men had an extreme value.' It was a time of 'romance and fantastic vows', not mere duty, but the pride of a true Knight to perform exploits of courage and valour. (e) Under Sir Robert Knolles, one of Lancasters greatest captains, John marched through Europe, past Arras, where they burnt the suburbs and ot to Bapaume and Roie, ravaging the country. At Noyon John, seeing his opportunity rode to its gates accompanied only by his page, where he dismounted and leaped over the barriers. He fought 'for upwards of an hour, alone against them all - giving many grand stokes with his lance. He wounded one or two of their Knights ..... they had so much pleasure in this combat, they frequently forgot themselves.' Eventually his page informed him that they must leave as his army was on the move again. Clearing the barriers, and mounted behind his page, he bid the French "Adieu, adieu, seigneurs, grands mercis" and spurred away to join his companions. (e) 1373, August: The duke of Lancaster crossed over to Calais with 15,000 mounted men, including 300 Scots lances. They crossed France unchallenged, from end to end, finishing at Bordeaux in December. "Much damage was done to the country side, but little else happened, for the French refused fighting and retired to fortified towns, and Lancaster refused seiges. .... The loss of men and horses from hardship and starvation had been terrible, and financially the whole expedition was disastrous.' His followers had to be paid. John de Swinton's bill amounted to £7 7s 4d. Lancasters fingers had been burnt and his credit exhausted. 1374-5: Edmund de Langley, Earl of Cambridge & later Duke of York (d), brother of John of Gaunt (Duke of Lancaster) headed the next overseas expedition. Chancery Files for Dec. 15, 1374 show a 'Fiat for Protection for a year for Sir John of Swynton Knight, about to go in the King's service beyond the seas" with Edmund, in the Gascon Rolls on February 16, 1375 there is further contractual agreement to Sir John de Swinton and others. Shortly before the death of the regent, Robert, Duke of Albany in 1419, a select band of Scots (6-7,000) were sent to the assistance of the King of France who was in danger of being conquered by King Henry V of England. The leaders were John Stewart (E. of Buchan), Archibald Douglas (E. of Wigton), Sir Robert Stewart (another son of the Regent), Sir Alexander Lindsay & Sir John Swinton. The 1st battle of importance was the Battle of Beaugé (France) in 1421, Mar. 22. An important victory was gained over the English, commanded by Henry V's brother, Thomas, the Duke of Clarence. Sir John espying Thomas (b) rode him down & unhorsed him. The English commander whom he recognised by the coronet set with precious stone, which the duke wore around his helmet. John wounded him so severely in the face with his lance that the Duke expired immediately. (d) By McIntosh (e) Clarence was not unhorsed but was wounded in the face by Swinton's lance. In great fury, Clarence put forward his horse to change Sir John Swinton. Others seeing this came to Sir John's assistance & in the fight the Duke was killed by the Earl of Buchan, who ran him through with his spear. The victory was of such importance that Buchan was awarded the "Baton of Constable of France". (f) This was written about by Walter Scott in "Lay of the Last Minstrel": 1424, Aug. 17: Ill fortune attended the Earls of Douglas & Bruce, when the combined forces of Scot & France were totally defeated by the English under the Duke of Bedford. This auxiliary force was commanded by the gallant Earl of (? Beauchant) Buchan, Constable of France, who was a son of Robert, Duke of Albany, Governor of Scotland.
